Samuel Coleridge-Taylor (1875-1912)

Samuel Coleridge Taylor was an English composer whose high regard won him the title "African Mahler." His mother was English, and his father was a Creole physician from Sierra Leone. The Creole people are descendants of freed slaves, including slaves from the United States.

Offertory: Elite Syncopations Scott Joplin (1868-1917)

Ragtime music was a short-lived musical trend that lasted from about 1897-1917. That period was defined by Joplin's appearance at the 1893 World's Fair, publication of his Maple Leaf Rag in 1899, and his death in 1917. Ragtime then contributed to the evolution of stride, jazz, and eventually big band swing genres.
