Prelude: Battle Hymn of the Republic (words by Julia Ward Howe, 1862) and The Prisoner's Hope (George F. Root)

This famous tune started as the song *Say Brothers Will You Meet* Us from the camp (religious) meetings of the late 1700s. The Glory, Hallelujah chorus was added later, in the early 1800s. That tune was borrowed to become *John Brown's Body*, the song about the abolitionist John Brown decomposing in his grave. The Battle Hymn of the Republic was one of several variations of the "John Brown" song intended to improve upon the irreverent lyrics that made people uncomfortable. "Battle Hymn" persisted as a favorite patriotic song used at the funerals of Winston Churchill, Walt Disney, and services for victims of September 11. *The Prisoner's Hope* is a similar tune with the lyrics "Tramp! Tramp! The boys are marching. Cheer up comrades they will come. And beneath the starry flag, we shall breathe the air again, of the free land in our own beloved home."
